


The Honhar Ladki Program Model

An education sponsorship and mentoring programme to support adolescent girls from rural and urban slums. Besides enrollment and sponsorship, the programme takes a multi-faceted approach to ensure parental commitment, achieve gender equality and reduce girls' drop-out rates by:

- Developing half-yearly progress reports
- > Arranging periodic parent-teacher meetings
- > Organising monthly sessions where IDF staff talk with teachers about attendance and performance
- > Providing mentors for the girls to help them become independent and develop self-confidence
- Organising awareness sessions for girls & their mothers to educate them on health and hygiene, menstruation and nutrition issues for their well-being.
